Attendance













Data as a Foundation for Continuous Improvement

This year, we implemented baseline data collection across all schools, reinforcing our commitment to a data-driven approach and continuous improvement. By establishing consistent measures in key areas—including attendance, graduation, return to district, progress toward goals, postsecondary readiness, and incident tracking—we have created a comprehensive foundation for evaluating student outcomes. These benchmarks enable us to assess performance with greater precision, inform strategic decision-making, and ensure accountability in advancing student success.



Building Capacity to Support Excellence

We strengthened our leadership and quality infrastructure this year, with more than 200 dedicated team members supporting our organization-wide commitment to excellence. These leaders, along with our curriculum, instructional, and clinical experts, provide critical guidance to over 3,000 staff members—including 790 teachers and 676 clinical and therapeutic professionals. Their expertise in state and local standards, coupled with a deep understanding of best practices in special education, ensures that our schools are equipped to deliver consistent, high-quality supports. By bolstering these teams, we are investing in the knowledge and leadership capacity that drive meaningful outcomes for students.


Our people are the heart of New Story. Last year, more than 3,180 staff members—teachers, clinicians, therapists, and support staff—made a difference in the lives of students every single day.

Our School-Based Programming supported students in Pennsylvania with autism and alternative education needs. Through our Specialized Support Services, we provided mental health clinicians in New Jersey, and BCBAs in Virginia. In Ohio, we partnered with private schools and families to deliver autism support programming.
